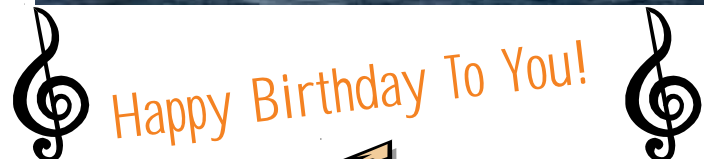

2007 has been a very successful year for CYCT PHRF Racing and Windseekers. Thanks to you; the participants, skippers, race crew, shore side party workers, race committee, and all the promoters. Thanks.

Our upgrading of the race program with *Romeo Charlie* our RC boat, has paid off big, producing increased revenue from race entry fees because the racing itself is that much better. 2007 attendance is way up. Fifteen boats sailed in the three race Harbor Series. Fun-On-Fridays had twenty boats on the water and we managed nine races over the five Friday series. The just completed Point Series had twenty-eight boats competing making for great racing.

## **General Meeting Minutes November 12, 2007**
