Treasure's Report

It is that time of year when we audit the club books and prepare a budget for next year. The club has made a number of advances in the last two years, we have added a new reciprocal in Tyee, so that visiting boats now have a specific slip available that is published in the Burgee Book, we have added a Race Committee Boat and improved the racing program for CYCT PHRF Racing and Windseeker Racing. Beginning in December we will have added a 50 ft Outstation/Reciprocal Slip at Dock Street in front of the Tacoma Glass Museum on the Tacoma Waterfront. As with all improvements, all this takes money. In reviewing the budget options, it was also noted that publishing the Mainsheet in print was costing approximately \$50.00 per year per active member. We had a number of options to balance the budget; use the past reserve from the Mariner 's fund raising, change the format of the Mainsheet so it was less costly, and/or raise the annual dues.

The board decided to raise the annual dues rather than using the Club's cash reserves. The Active Member dues will increase to \$225 and for anyone who would like the mainsheet mailed to them rather than retrieving it off the web. There would be a subscription charge of \$50 per year for the printing and mailing of the Mainsheet. This may seem a little steep to some, but keep in mind, I have been a member of the yacht club since 1998 and this is the first dues increase then. Also, If you use the outstation at Tacoma Waterfront twice a year you will be ahead.

Personally, I think the improvements we have accomplished in the last few years are worth it, and I hope you do too.

Windseekers Holiday series November 3rd and 24th 2007

STARTING AND FINISHING AREA: Start and finish area will be in the vicinity of the TYEE MARINA.

START TIME: First start for each race will be scheduled for 1100.

COURSE: Courses will be announced at the Skippers Meeting broadcast on VHF Channel 68 as soon as possible after the Skippers Meeting and rebroadcast on VHF 68 fifteen (15) minutes before the first scheduled start.

TIME LIMIT: Three (3) hours for the first boat. If a boat finishes within three hours all other boats must finish within one hour of the first boat to finish or within three hours from the start, which ever is longer. After reaching the time limit the first place finishing boat may motor back through the fleet finishing boats as they stand on the course. This changes RRS Rules 28.1 and 35.
