## Past Commodore Report

Nice to know information on global warming: Carbon dioxide has been singled out as the major (if not only) cause of global warming. Of course, the major source is burning of fossil fuels. Carbon dioxide makes up less than 1 percent of the atmosphere. Water vapor is about 5 times more efficient at reflecting the sun's energy, and makes up from 5 to 15 percent of the atmosphere. Methane is also a "green house" gas (a lot is expelled from herbivores), and so is sulfur dioxide which comes in part from the earth's volcanic activity.

Human activity, most likely, is part of the cause, but a global warming is complex problem, and there no one fix.

The Skippers meeting is 1000 at the Clubhouse and leave the crew home. Observers are allowed. I always get asked that question. The other question is about autopilots. No autopilots should be my answer but how do you enforce it? So autopilots are in but remember, when *Discovery* goes flying by it's done without an autopilot for maximum effect.

Next year 2008's race schedule is shaping up and I'd love to post it here but people need to see my rough draft and tear it apart first. I guess that's why they call it a rough draft. It will be in November's Mainsheet.

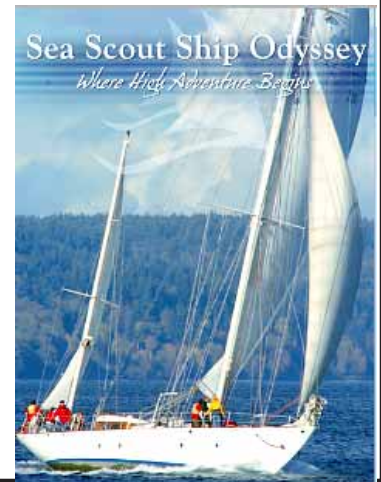

*October 6th, 2007*

**Eligibility:** Open to all monohull boats with valid PHRF ratings current at the time of race. All boats must meet PIYA Category III safety requirements. All entries must be a member in good standing in one of the following; Corinthian Yacht Club of Tacoma, Gig Harbor Yacht Club, Quartermaster Yacht Club, Tacoma Yacht Club or Three Tree Point Yacht Club.

**Registration:** A completed registration form and appropriate funds must be in the possession of CYCT's Race Chairman by 1800 hour on the Friday prior to the intended race, or presented at the skippers meeting on October 6th.

**Skippers Meeting:** Skippers Meeting will be held at 1830 Friday October 5th at Duke's Chowder House, 3327 Ruston Way, Tacoma.

**Class Flags, Rating Breaks and Starting order:** Class flags, rating breaks and starting order will be posted at the CYCT Clubhouse Bulletin Board by 0800 on July 14th and broadcast on VHF Channel 68 prior to the first warning of each day's racing. They will also be announced at the Skippers Meeting. After the first race of the day, the Race Committee will determine the starting order.

**Check-In, And Check-Out:** Each day before the start of racing, the Race Committee requires all boats to sail by the Race Committee boat STARBOARD side to STARBOARD side and hail with their sail numbers. A boat that withdraws or retires shall notify the Race Committee at the earliest opportunity via VHF Channel 68 or by hail.

**START AND FINISH AREA:** The start and finish area will be in Commencement Bay.

**COURSES:** Courses will be posted on the Race Committee Boat.

**STARTING ORDER:** The Race Committee will determine the starting order.

**START TIME:** The first warning is scheduled for 0955. Furthermore, up to four races may be held.

**TIME LIMIT:** Two (2) hours for the first boat in each class. If a boat finishes within two hours all other boats in her class must finish within 15 minutes of the first boat to finish or within two hours from the start, whichever is longer. This changes RRS Rule 35.

**SCORING:** Only the top four finishers in each race per club will be scored. The Yacht Club with the least total points will win the Perpetual COMMENCEMENT BAY CHALLENGE TROPHY. In case of tie, the last race run will be used as a tiebreaker. This changes RRS Rule Appendix A2.


**AWARDS:** Awards will be presented after the race at the Dock Street Tavern on the Thea Foss Waterway with moorage available at the Working Waterfront Museum.
