If no specific information was sent then only contact info is shown. CYCT is not responsible for errors or omissions, except for inadvertent typographical errors in extracting the information.

Please observe the rules. You are representing Corinthian Yacht Club of Tacoma; Always fly your CYCT burgee.

If you visit a reciprocal club displaying burgees in their clubhouse, and our burgee is not among those displayed, please advise our Board of Directors, and one will be sent.

Moorage is located in Cap Sante Marina on “P” & “Q” docks. Slip P-19 will accommodate a maximum length of 40 feet. Slip Q-6 will accommodate boats up to 50 feet. Guests are asked to register with the Cap Sante Marina staff upon arrival. Reciprocal is available year round. Usage is limited to one night every seven days per yacht. Check out is 12 Noon. Please contact Cap Sante Marina Port offices, 360-293-0694 for slip assignment verification.

The clubhouse is located at the North End of the Cap Sante Boat Haven. Although it is not open on daily basis, it is open Friday nights 1730 to 2030 for “cocktail hour”. You are welcome anytime the clubhouse is open.

The club bar and lounge, located in the clubhouse directly above the reciprocal docks, is staffed by volunteer. Winter hours are 1700 to 2100 hours, Thursday through Saturday and summer hours are 1700 to 2100 hours Wednesday through Friday. To comply with state liquor laws, you will need to show your CYC membership card and may, of course, bring guests with you. They also invite you to join them for a Fridays at Five held every first and third Friday each month. These are social functions with free appetizers.

CFSA is very pleased to invite CYC members to use their facilities when visiting the Victoria area. Visiting yachts must call "Port Security" on channel 10 VHF prior to entering Esquimalt Harbour and report the name of the yacht, number of persons aboard and your destination (CFSA). All craft must keep clear of military facilities, such as wharves and there are yellow buoys of the naval jetties to define the closest allowable approach. Under normal conditions, this is all a matter of routine, but you may be approached by a guard boat for a visual inspection. Boarding is unlikely.

Reciprocal facilities and services are as follows:

1. First two days moorage – no charge. Further moorage at CAN\$0.50/foot/day to a total of seven days alongside twice yearly.
2. Water and 15 amp electricity is available on the floats at no charge.
3. Shower and hot water – no charge.
4. Gate to foreshore opened by code. See duty bartender.
5. Clubhouse and bar open Tuesday to Sunday inclusive – times posted.

There are detailed instructions for entering CSFA marina. Call for directions. If problems contact Jack Dennett 250-385-7833.

Our Club facilities are located in the South-Western portion of Blue Heron Basin, which is in the western end of Tsehum Harbour. Please follow the dredged channel carefully.

We offer 2 days free moorage twice a year, then further time at \$0.50 per foot, in total, no more than 7 days annually. Electricity charge is \$3.00 each day of your visit. Place appropriate Canadian funds in the payment deposit box. Our reciprocal moorage consists of 100 feet of warfage at our visitors dock as well as extra moorage when members slips are vacant. No reciprocal moorage is available for vessels over 50' or 14.5' in beam. Temporarily tie up at the visitors dock. It is painted red and is the first dock you see as you enter the basin. Immediately register at the visitor's booth at the head of the dock. There is a "Club Members sign out log" posted in the visitors booth. This is where members note the location of berth and dates it's available for guests. When you choose a berth, please enter your name and date of arrival on the visitors list. Ask any member to give you a key from the drawer. Vessels must not be left unattended overnight. Refueling and barbequing on the wharfs are prohibited. Barbeque pits are available at the southwest corner of the clubhouse. Club Burgees must be flown. It is also requested that your vessels ensign and a Canadian Courtesy Flag be flown. No maintenance or repair work is permitted except for emergencies. Please return the CCYC key into a drop box before you leave the berth.

CYC provides Guest Moorage for visiting members of yacht clubs exchanging reciprocal privileges. Reservations are not taken. **The Moorage on the North side of the Shilshole clubhouse is no longer available**, since there is not enough room at the new location.

CYC may reimburse reciprocal club members (depending on usage) for moorage fees paid the marina. During the present stage of marina re-construction, there is extremely limited guest moorage available. Hail the Shilshole Bay Marina Harbormaster on VHF Channel 17 and ask for a guest berth. Pay your guest moorage fees, keep a receipt and request the CYC Reciprocal Form. Write your home address on an envelope (it will be used to send you your reimbursement). Place the filled out form and your Shilshole Bay Marina moorage fee receipt in the envelope. Slide the envelope into the club's mail slot,

located just below the office window, at the top of the ramp leading to the parking lot. You will be reimbursed for a maximum of two consecutive days moorage. If you have any questions please contact the CYC Club Manager at 206-789-1919 or e-mail at cycsea@eskimo.com. Shilshole Bay Marina Office is open M-F 8:00 to 4:30 PM and Saturday from 8:00 to 1:00 PM. Office phone number is (206) 728-3006.

DIYC is located approximately 1 mile SW of the Tacoma Narrows Bridge, on the Tacoma (east) side of the channel. Due to shallow water, entrance to the yacht basin is restricted until there is a +4 foot tide. A water depth marker is located on the breakwater as you enter the mouth of the basin. (Editorial comment: This marina may not be suitable for deep draft sailboats.)

There is 120 feet of reciprocal moorage, with water and 20/30 Amp electrical service. Garbage dumpster is located at the head of the pier. Covered picnic tables are adjacent to the moorage. Lavatory and showers are located in the basement of the clubhouse.

Upon arrival, please contact the caretaker to register. All guests their club burgee while using the facilities. Gate access cards are available from the caretaker. This requires a \$10.00 deposit. Forty-eight (48) hours of moorage per calendar month is available. There is not charge.

Availability is on a first come first serve basis and you can arrive without reservations. There is limited space for vessels over 35'.

Eagle Harbour is located between Point Atkinson, (Lighthouse Park), and Fisherman's Cove, in West Vancouver and offers a beautiful south, south-west view. Specifically it is 49.21.8 N and 123.16.2 west.

Prior notification is advisable. Phone 604-921-7636, email ehyc@ehyc.ca or fax 604-921-7631. Our Superintendent Colleen Santer will greet you and direct you to a berth.

Your first 2 nights are free, with a .50/ft per night charge for future nights, if moorage is available. All boats are moored at their own risk, EHYC will not be liable for any loss or damage to visiting boats.

The available moorage spaces belong to EHYC members who are absent from their space. Moorage space is restricted to 38' in length including appendages and 12' beam. Longer boats can be accommodated at the discretion of the Club Superintendent at the time. Water, power is very limited (15A max). Our clubhouse has washrooms with showers, telephone, but no restaurant or bar facilities.

During the period May through September, EYC offers 100 feet of moorage located on the south side of the long dock in front of the former yacht club building, just north after entering the Everett Marina. They offer 48 hours of complimentary moorage, after which moorage will be charged at \$0.75 per foot per day. Electricity (30 amps) is \$4.00 per day. Boat length is limited to 50', and visits shall not exceed 7 days in any 30-day period. Adjacent boats will appreciate at 2200 hour curfew with respect to noise.

Upon your arrival, please register at the drop box at the head of the reciprocal dock ram. As always, please have your current membership card available and fly your club burgee while at EYC dock. The restroom facility requires a code for use after 2200 hours. That code is obtainable from the dock master or from Port Security.

You are invited to join us Wednesday nights upstairs in the yacht club building, now known as the Marine View Reception and Conference Center. The bar opens at 1800 hour and they offer a surprise dinner, potluck, or BBQ each Wednesday evening.

FCYC extends full reciprocal privileges to visiting guests. Due to the popularity of the Vancouver area as a destination, moorage is extremely tight. Moorage reservations can be made by calling 604-648-BOAT (2628) or 1-866-677-BOAT (2628) or on VHF 66A.

FCYC is located on the north side of False Creek, with the clubhouse on the top floor of the three story building under the Granville Street Bridge (above Riley's Restaurant).

- Visitors are required to fly their burgee.
- Visitors are asked to sign in with the Welcome Center upon arrival and present your membership card.
- Visiting yachts are entitled to one night's free moorage and utility per visit and two visits per yacht per year.
- Shore facilities include restrooms, showers and laundry.
- Visitors will be issued a marina key which must be returned.

Electricity is \$4.00 per day for 30A. Moorage privileges are at the guests risk, FYC will not be responsible for any damage or loss resulting from the use of the docks.

Flounder Bay Yacht Club is located in Skyline Marina. Guest slips are listed on the membership sign-out listing posted in the FBYC laundry room. A courtesy dock is available for check-in purposes. Visiting vessels must display their burgee at all time and should also be prepared to present a current yacht club membership card if requested.

Moorage slips are available from 30' to 44'. Occasionally, there may be a 50' slip available. No part of a vessel may extend over the walkway and no more than 4' of the vessel may extend beyond the piling into the marina fairway. Vessels may not be left unattended overnight. Dock Rules are posted at the head of the ramp and on the bulletin board near the FBYC exit gate.

Visitors must complete the Guest Register and fill out a Registration form immediately upon arrival. Visits are limited to a total of five (5) days per calendar year. Moorage rates: Day number one is complementary, although there is a \$3.00 charge for electricity. Days two through five are US\$10.00 and include electricity. Dockside water and 30 Amp power is available at each slip. An "Honor Box" for moorage payments is located in the laundry room.

Restrooms, coin-operated showers and laundry are located at the head of the dock ramp in the downstairs portion of the two-story building.

Gig Harbor Yacht Club has an 80' guest dock for reciprocal use at the Peninsula Yacht Basin Marina. Rafting is permitted. GHYC will provide up to 48 hours free moorage; there is a nominal charge for power. Arrangements for long stays can be made through the marina owner, Steve Luengen, at his going rate and upon slip availability. Steve's hours are 0900 to 1700 Tuesday through Saturday from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend, and the same hours Monday through Friday the rest of the year. After hours, check the chalkboard next to the office for available slips if the reciprocal moorage is full. Please do not use any slips not posted. Special arrangements can be made with GHYC Commodore when a club cruise is held in the harbor for longer than two days.

The combination to the showers and security gate lock is written on the Registration Forms, which will be located in a metal box on the office windowsill, if the office is closed. Put the completed registration slip in the mail slot to the left of the door, and please fly you yacht club burgee.

Kingston Cove Yacht Club's reciprocal moorage is located in the Port of Kingston Marina. They have two 50 foot slips, available on a first come, first serve basis. There is a nominal \$4.00 per day dock charge for all boats which includes power if desired. We offer the first nights moorage free. Subsequent nights moorage is charged at \$.30 per foot for up to 3 consecutive nights total. After docking, please register at the Port Office and show your current yacht club membership card. You may receive the combination to the restrooms and laundry from Port personnel upon registering. Please fly your burgee while docked in our reciprocal moorage.

You are invited to stop over in Kingston and enjoy the KCYC facilities. Their modern clubhouse, adjacent to the marina, is generally open on Friday evenings for Happy Hour and Saturday s (summer only) for Barbeques.

Port of Kingston has a telephone reservation program for roughly half of their available slips. Call Port of Kingston at 360-297-3545 for details. The two 50' reciprocal slips of KCYC are not reservable.

The Port of Everett has agreed to assist Mukilteo Yacht Club in their reciprocal moorage program. The Port will receive full restitution for any moorage used by visiting boaters under the reciprocal agreement at the time the slip is used. The Port will in turn provide information to the visiting boater on how to obtain reimbursement.

Reciprocal moorage will be provided from available guest moorage slips. A maximum of two slips will be utilized by MYC at any given time. In the event all the guest moorage slips are in use or if two slips are already occupied under the reciprocal moorage plan then the requesting boater will be informed that there are no reciprocal moorage slips available.

If slips are available inform the requesting boater which slip to use and have them report to the Port Office for payment. The following procedures should be used:

1. All visitors must check in with the Port of Everett (POE) Dock Master upon arrival. Moorage will be assigned on a first come—first served basis with two slips available for MYC reciprocals. Visitors have been encouraged to check-in with the Dock master via VHF channel 16 or by phone (425-259-6001) prior to arrival.
2. At the office the Dock Master should verify a current yacht club membership from a participating club. Then inform the boater that up to two nights of moorage will be reimbursed by MYC to the Port of Everett, and then be signed in on the Mukilteo Yacht Club Reciprocal list at the Port Office. The moorage will be free and the Port of Everett will bill MYC.
3. Reciprocal visitors are limited to two nights or 48 consecutive hours of free moorage. Reciprocal visits are limited to one visit per month per vessel.

All visiting vessels must fly their club burgee while moored at the POE guest docks

OHYC provides moorage at the South end of “F” dock. Enter the marina from the south lat 48 17.035N lon 122 38.158W. The first four, 40 foot slips immediately to port, numbers 48, 49, 50 and 51 are provided for reciprocal use as posted. Please fly your burgee. Register with the harbormaster and obtain a gate key. Your stay at reciprocal moorage and electricity (30 amp) are free for 48 hours. Registration is necessary for OHYC to continue funding. Beyond 48 hours, you must move your boat to another slip, so that other reciprocal members can use these accommodations. **NOTE:** These slips are not available during race week in July.

Good fresh water, electricity and pump out station are on the dock. Restrooms, showers and laundry are available at the marina ashore. Also available is a full line of maintenance, repair and dive services.

OHYC club bar and lounge are open Wednesday through Saturday afternoons and evenings. The hours are posted. Every Friday night they have Hamburger Night. Hamburgers cost \$3.00 plus bring a potluck dish.

48 complimentary hours. Limit of 5 days total in any 1 year period. Electricity \$3/day for 30A/110V.

Budd Inlet is relatively shallow so watch your charts and depth sounder. The main channel follows the west shore of Budd Inlet passing west of Olympia Shoal (47.04.0' N, 122.55.2' W). Do not go between the shoal markers: Many a skipper, including some of Uncle Sam's best, have tried and failed. The entrance into Olympia is a clearly marked dredged channel; just keep the Red buoys close to starboard. The channel splits with the left channel leading to East Bay and the Port of Olympia's Swantown marina and boatyard. The main channel veers due south towards the Capitol Building dome. OYC's guest dock is the last dock to starboard.

Tie up to the guest dock and fill out a registration form in the kiosk. Place the envelop stub in your window on the dock side. You need not pay until you leave. Please have your yacht club membership card available and fly your Burgee. No rafting is allowed. Additional contact numbers and other instructions are posted at the gate and at the caretakers house. Check out time is 11:00 AM.
